
Today we celebrate all the students who participated in Elim's got Talent, we were blown away by you all! Here is a photo of Hannah and Janelle doing their thing!

As you may already know, Elim has expanded the Golflands Campus and has created middle school buildings. This article is based on the energy efficiency and the cool features that are included in this new part of the campus.

The solar resources that we have are LED lights, charging outlets and auto powered lights. LED stands for light emitting diode, it is a semiconductor diode that glows when voltage is applied. LED lights uses less electricity than other lights and they last longer, making them useful and environmentally friendly. We have these at school in classrooms.

Secondly, charging outlets, which is a built in outlet that you can plug a charger into or anything that is able to fit into it, it gives power to a device and grants them with more power and battery percentage.

Another one of the many power efficiency appliances at Elim are auto powered lights, these are bulbs that emit a glowing light when electricity is added to it, except with auto powered lights it detects whenever forces enter the room, like when a person enters the classroom the light turns on and emits light automatically. When nobody is in the room they automatically turn off.

These are some amazing additional features added to the new buildings and they are very helpful, as an addition, they also save a ton of money.
