Pacific On Campus Experience (POCE) Scholarship Programme 2018 "Successfully transitioning Pacific students to tertiary studies"

The University of Otago's POCE Programme is an opportunity for Year 13 students of Pacific heritage to visit the university's Dunedin campus. The aims of the Programme are: • Promote the University of Otago as the best university for Pacific students • Promote tertiary education to Pacific students and their communities • Provide hands-on assistance and guidance with study choices • Present Dunedin as a great university city for students to find their place in the world. Thirty Pacific senior students nationwide are selected competitively on the basis of reference from their School Principal, a set-topic essay (500 words) and their NCEA results. Over a three-day period, the successful recipients will attend an organised programme including living

in a Residential College, visit academic departments and meet academic support staff. Another important feature of this programme will be to attend the Dunedin Tertiary Open Day. All expenses (travel, accommodation in residential colleges, programme activities and meals) are met by the scholarship. POCE runs from Sunday 6 - Tuesday 8 May 2018. Limitless possibilities come from combining creative design, science, engineering and business.

What to take at school..... University Entrance through NCEA requirements or have completed the IB Diploma or have at least 120 points on the UCAS Tarriff with D grades in approved subjects for CIE.

At least 14 credits in Level 2 NCEA Science and Mathematics strongly recommended (have passed AS level Mathematics in CIE or have achieved a 4 SL Maths for IB), while those intending to take the Chemical & Healthcare Product Formulation major should ideally have 14 credits in Level 3 NCEA Chemistry (IB Chemistry with 4 HL or 6 SL; CIE Chemistry D grade (A level) or A grade (AS level).

NCEA credits in related subjects such as Digital Technologies, Technology, or Design and Visual Communication would be an advantage.
