AUT School Leaver Scholarships 2019

In 2019 AUT School Leaver Scholarships are available under the categories below. These categories are the same as those offered for study in 2017 and 2018.

Academic Excellence: Awarded to students demonstrating leadership through academic excellence.

Significant Student: Awarded to academically able students demonstrating leadership through achievement at a high level in school, sporting, cultural pursuits or community involvement. Applicants under this category must hold leadership positions and/or be active in cultural pursuits or sport at a representative level.

Kiwa: Awarded to Maori and Pacific students demonstrating all-round ability and leadership potential. Applicants applying under this category must declare that they are of Maori or Pacific descent and also declare their ethnicity.

New Horizons: Awarded to academically able students who can demonstrate leadership potential from Auckland Region Decile 1-4 schools.

Application is through the AUT Scholarship Application Portal and students are encouraged to indicate all categories for which they are eligible within the portal. The value of the scholarship is \$6,500. Due to the Government's Fees-Free policy for first year students this will be paid towards accommodation or as a living allowance paid in three instalments throughout the year.

The only change for 2019 is that the scholarship will initially be for one year only. Recipients of these scholarships who pass all papers and meet the eligibility requirements at the completion of their first year will then apply within the AUT Scholarship Application Portal for the AUT Undergraduate Scholarship (Fees) available for all subsequent years of study at AUT. The undergraduate scholarships will also be available in the categories listed above.

College of Education 2019 - Applications opened on the 1st May 2018

- **Bachelor Of Arts – Education**

Topics covered include: educational psychology (how children, young people, and adults learn), and cultural, social, and political influences that have shaped education systems and curricula both nationally and internationally. The study of gender, disability, Māori education, and ICT also feature in undergraduate study

- **Early Childhood Education**

In this three-year programme, you will explore education theory, professional practice and curriculum studies, within the context of early childhood education in Aotearoa New Zealand. You will have some opportunity for specialist subject studies and a minimum of 23 weeks' teaching experience in a variety of early childhood settings

- **Primary Education**

This three-year programme addresses professional teaching issues, subject knowledge, education theory, practical teaching experience, and the requirements of the New Zealand Curriculum. During your degree, you will have a minimum of 23 weeks' teaching experience in a range of settings. Offered in Dunedin and Invercargill.

- **Secondary Education**

A one-year programme for people who have already graduated with a university degree (360 point, level 7) or approved equivalent. You will take six compulsory papers addressing pedagogy, curriculum studies, evidence-based inquiry, and diversity and inclusion, and spend approximately half of your programme time in schools under the guidance of a mentor teacher. A B+ grade average in the final year (300 level) major subject requirement of your undergraduate degree or in the course components of a postgraduate qualification is required for admission

Please note: To teach in the secondary sector, applicants must have completed papers in their proposed teaching subjects, to specified levels. For further information, please see the secondary curriculum subjects table at the end of this document and consult the Secondary Programme Coordinator if necessary.

REACH SCHOLARSHIP

Applications Open : 10 May Applications Close: 15 June

R.E.A.C.H (REACH): Realising Educational Aspirations for Careers in Health, is a scholarship for Year 13 Māori secondary students interested in a career in health. The REACH Scholarship provides a fully funded opportunity for Year 13 Māori students to spend three nights and two full days on the Otago University campus exploring health science degree options. Flights, transfers, food and accommodation in a University of Otago Residential College are included. REACH will help you gain an understanding of 'life' on campus and learn about health science study and degree/career options at the University of Otago. You will participate in hands-on learning including lectures, labs and 'tutes', visit several of the University of Otago's Residential Colleges and meet key Māori contacts on campus.

Eligibility: Applications are sought from full time Year 13 students of Māori descent, who are currently enrolled in a New Zealand Secondary School and are considering studying at the University of Otago the following year. All applicants should be students who are completing their final year of secondary schooling and are likely to gain University Entrance (UE).

Application Process: Every student must submit a completed application AND a confidential reference (from either their Principal, Deputy Principal, Assistant Principal or Year 13 Dean) via the online application tool at: www.otago.ac.nz/mhwdu/tearahauora

Selection Process: Criteria for selection includes: * The quality of the REACH Scholarship application * Interest in a career in health * Commitment to Māori development * Academic ability * The MHWDU's strategic priorities relating to access and opportunity for Māori

Decisions made regarding the selection of students for the REACH Scholarship are final and no correspondence will be entered into. The University of Otago's Māori Health Workforce Development Unit wishes to acknowledge the support received from the Ministry of Health.
