KELLIHER ECONOMICS FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Kelliher Economics Foundation was set up by the late Sir Henry J Kelliher in 1965 to advance knowledge of Economics to the wider community. Today the Foundation continues to offer financial support to students wishing to study Economics at a New Zealand tertiary institute.

The Scholarship covers years two and three of an undergraduate degree (year one being Government funded), with the annual value of each scholarship being the full tuition fees cost per annum, being paid directly to the tertiary institution. In order for students to maintain their grant they must include economics in their study programme each semester/trimester and achieve satisfactory academic results across all papers.

We are now accepting applications for the Kelliher Economics Foundation Awards for 2018 and would encourage you to promote this scholarship to worthy students. 
