A brief summary of the last few months of 2017

We have come through many meetings, communications and decisions. Elim Proprietors and the BEST Trust have worked superbly well to pioneer this development. With the previous government approving a roll increase for Elim Christian College, we have now been able to enrol almost 200 students (the roll cap is 200 for 2018) and work our way through the process of forming a staffing team. Whilst the parent community will have the benefit of significantly reduced attendance dues, the Ministry of Education's fiscal model for school operation is quite challenging and has meant restructuring of staffing and resourcing. We are however, confident and full of anticipation with the preparation underway for a superb start to the 2018 school year.

We are thankful for the work of Mr Ray Webb as Residual Manager in the advice and support he has provided both to BEST and to the Elim team – it has been and continues to be a massive task.

The new staffing team has now had two meetings with their Botany and Golflands counterparts and great progress is being achieved. All staff from our three campuses will spend three days together in late January prior to school commencing for students on Wednesday 7 February.

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Start of 2018 School Year Information

Student Handbook

In the first week of school, all families will be sent a link by email which will give you access to the student handbook for family reference. Along with our website, this handbook will provide help and guidance for a range of school matters. Should you require a hard copy please request this from the school office.

Uniforms

If you are yet to organise all uniform items, please contact John Russell Menswear— his details are on our website. Secondly, parents are advertising second-hand items via the ARISE Parents Facebook page. All students are expected to wear clean, neatly presented and approved uniform clothing at all times.

School Stationery

As a school, we recommend purchasing student stationery using OfficeMax. They offer a price promise and your purchase earns rewards for the school.

Elim Mt Albert Campus stationery lists are preloaded into the OfficeMax online ordering platform which is called MySchool. Ordering online makes buying stationery very easy as this allows for payment by credit card, pre-ordering now for payment and delivery at a nominated future date and delivery to your personal address with no delivery charge for orders over \$46.00. In addition, you can pay your special character donation and any school supplied items at the same time.

While you can also print your stationery lists from our website and earn rewards for the school by shopping at any OfficeMax branch by letting them know you are attending Elim Mt Albert Campus, we thoroughly recommend you use the MySchool online ordering system to ensure you also cover off the school supplied items and other information you might otherwise miss.

State-Integrated Schooling

Over the first few newsletters next year we will provide information on the distinctives of being a state-integrated school. We will also ensure such information is featured on our website.

Governance

In all state-integrated schools, there are two distinct governance entities:

- 1) **Proprietors** who safeguard the special character and take care of property development.
- 2) **Board of Trustees** who focus on student achievement and educational outcomes. The BOT as we refer to them, are made up of 5 parent elected trustees, 4 proprietor appointees, 1 student trustee and the Principal.

Payments

- Parents pay 'attendance dues' (not fees) to the proprietors for the cost of property. Attendance dues do not come to the school, rather to the Elim Christian Proprietors Trust. For all queries regarding Attendance dues, email: john@roberts.co.nz
- The special character term by term donation comes to the Board of Trustees (school) who use this to provide spiritual resources not provided by the government.
- The cost of uniform does not feature any profit for us; we direct you to John Russell who provides an excellent service.

- There are a number of costs associated with trips, learning activities, technology, digital resourcing, sport, music and so on. We will endeavour to communicate well regarding these costs.
- School and/or class camps are costly and need to be planned for. Advance details regarding these taking place in Term 1, will be out very soon.
- Mt Albert Campus will not have an onsite bursar and parents / caregivers are encouraged to use the online portal for viewing and paying for activities and donations. Eftpos will be available from the school office. A payment deposit box for cash payments and permission slips is also available. The School Day
