Recently, we held a Reading Curriculum Evening at the Golflands Campus. We choose to regularly hold curriculum evenings on both campuses because your child needs to have good Reading, Writing and Maths skills to be able to do well in every area of learning at school and in life. In Years 0-8, classroom teachers assess your child's reading, writing and maths skills against National Standards. We report to you twice a year on whether your child has gained the skills needed to meet the standards for their particular year.
