Important Reminder regarding NCEA Assessment for National Qualifications Policies and Procedures (Senior Campus Handbook: Appendix 5 pages 37-40):

Lateness and Extensions:

- An adequate assessment opportunity is defined as being present for the assessment.
- Students must hand in all assessment items on the due date or Not Achieved will be awarded. In a case of exceptional circumstances for a legitimate reason, an extension may be granted using the process described below:
- Where there is a legitimate reason for lateness or a student is missing for a valid reason, i.e. illness, bereavement etc., justification must be documented and presented to the student's teacher. The teacher, in consultation with the Principal's Nominee, must be satisfied that the absence is legitimate by a doctor's medical certificate or formal written contact by caregivers. The teacher will give an extension, approve a further opportunity (where it is practicable to do so) or award a grade if evidence has been recorded that the student has met all criteria in other authentic work.
- This will be done in consultation between the Principal's Nominee and the subject teacher.

On Thursday, 16th of March, the amazing year 5-6 journalism eagles group traveled to the very interesting Horton Media. When we first arrived we were amazed by how many medals and trophies they had there were gold, silver and bronze (most of the medals were gold and the trophies were glass). As we headed to the reception we were greeted nicely by our hosts, Mr Mike Horler and Mr Trevor Hannam. As we settled on the comfy chairs we started our questions, Caitlyn asked, " If you like to write when did you discover your talent?" Mr Horler answered, "I can't write! But I love reading". Caitlyn sat opened mouthed. We were all very surprised. Brilliant questions flowed through

our mouths. Sadly we had to stop and

actually go into the factory.

When we entered the printing press, in the first room we expected it to be hot and humid because of all the electricity it used but when when stepped into it, it was cold! We asked the question "Why is it cold and not hot?" This time Mr. Hannam answered and told us "We keep the temperature down because of the machines. The machines have very special lasers and when it gets too hot they explode! Also when they explode they cost a lot of money. It is much cheaper to air

condition it." Then he showed us all the colours in the newspaper: cyan, magenta, yellow and black.

along the factory we saw that the paper that they use was way more than we used at school, it was more then a red carpet!

We moved on to more exciting parts. We saw how they put the newspaper into bags and staple them together. The machine was so long that it took a lot of space in one room. We saw how much

paper there was leftover that it would be all most impossible to recycle, but still they are excellent at recycling. When we left we carried small, but heavy rolls of paper.

We learnt and explored wonderful things and we left with new knowledge.
