From the Principal

Kia Ora everyone

At our recent annual BOT/Senior Leadership Team review, we recognised the need to look again at how much information parents are receiving on the changes to Golflands Campus for 2018. In addition to us continuing to provide updates in our weekly newsletters we have commenced work on an FAQ page for our website. We will let you know when it is functional.

This week's thoughts—the concept of a middle school is not new:

- It is firstly an American icon;
- Secondly it is an extension of our New Zealand Intermediate School concept. The
 Intermediates have been an institution in New Zealand for probably 70 years or
 more;
- Thirdly over the past 20 years a number of existing Intermediates have been extended to become a middle school (either Y8-10 or Y7-10);
- Lastly, the Ministry of Education has for the past 10 years been actively building middle schools or 'junior high schools' and no longer builds Intermediates.

We are still one school and from 2018 onwards we will effectively have 3 age groupings on two campuses: Y1-6 existing now at Golflands, Y7-10 which is new and will be housed on the newly constructed buildings at Golflands and our Y11-13 senior area based at Botany Campus. Next year is a transition year as we shift and settle in. Golflands Campus will be the most populated site for staff and students from 2018 onwards.

Next week is the last week of this term and we finish with a full school morning assembly at our Botany Campus.

South Eastern Zone Basketball



Matthew Loh competed extremely hard, racing in 12 different swimming heats and making it through to 4 finals! His results were:


- 4th in 50m breaststroke

"Thank you to everyone who helped with the Year 7 bake sale last week! We raised a massive \$467.00 and this money will go towards the Worldwide Fund for Nature."




Did you know that the most frequent accident is a backend collision? This is because the average adult driver reaction speed of 1 second is not enough time to avoid a collision.
