Year 7 and 8 Homework Expectations

Homework is an integral part of student life and as such we endeavour to set homework tasks that will complement learning within the classroom. The expectation is that Year 7 and 8 students will spend approximately half an hour on homework each week night. However, due to the fact that many students have very busy schedules, we set weekly homework to allow students flexibility to choose when they complete their homework. Each week students are expected to complete 1 hour of Mathletics - gaining 2000 points, 1 hour of reading recording evidence in their google classroom, 3x 15 minute sessions on Membean at their level. Students may also like to spend some time training for our Run4Bibles event, coming up in week 3.

At Year 7 and 8 levels, students will learn important passages of scripture. Starting with the first verse, they will continue to add to it throughout the term until they are confident with the whole passage. This term we will be studying– 1 Corinthians 13:1-13 (NIV). This is an exciting part of our Scripture program which will give students a firm foundation in some great passages of scripture that will stay with them for life.

1	1 Corinthians 13:1-13 New International Version (NIV) Love If I speak in the tongues ^[a] of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. ² If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing.
2	³ If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast, ^[b] but do not have love, I gain nothing.
3	⁴ Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. ⁵ It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. ⁶ Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. ⁷ It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.
4	⁸ Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away.
5	⁹ For we know in part and we prophesy in part, ¹⁰ but when completeness comes, what is in part disappears.
6	¹¹ When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me.
7	¹² For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.
8	¹³ And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.
