In April this year, twelve Year 11-13 students from both the Botany and Mt Albert campuses, along with two teachers, had the amazing opportunity to go to Taiwan on a cultural exchange trip. During our time in Taiwan, we visited three cities: Taipei, Hualien, and Taitung, where we visited the old streets Jiufen and Shifen, spent a fun night at the aquarium, visited five schools, and made many new friends. The trip gave us valuable insight into a culture vastly different from ours, allowing us to step out of our comfort zone while having a great time.

During our travels, we learnt a great deal about the history, customs, and way of life in Taiwan, such as the language and the flavourful local cuisine. A personal highlight for many of us was experiencing the life of a typical Taiwanese high school student, where each of us spent a full school day of nine hours at one of the high schools. Additionally, we gained a newfound appreciation for the importance of communication and language. Attempting to overcome the language barrier with our broken Mandarin was quite a struggle at first, but during the course of the trip we managed to learn a few more phrases to take back to New Zealand.

Our team made this possible and we were so blessed to have this opportunity to be able to learn more about ourselves, the inclusive Taiwanese culture, and the value of appreciating one another. #### YEAR 12 & 13 GEOGRAPHY

Students studying Year 12 and Year 13 Geography are conducting an investigation into the characteristics of different beach types. On the 28th of May, we visited Eastern Beach, and on the 5th of May, we braved the weather to travel to Tawharanui, where we studied two contrasting beaches: Anchor Bay and Jones Bay. The students measured beach profiles and wind speeds, observed surf and wave conditions and took sediment samples. Once back at school, they analyse this data in order to better understand the different natural elements, processes, and agents that interact to form coastal environments.
