Student Highlight - Tanika van Dijk (Year 13)

Over the King's birthday weekend, Tanika competed at the Interprovincial Champs (IPC) for volleyball. Representing the Waitakere East Central Auckland region, Tanika and her team finished in 5th place at IPC which is an amazing achievement for her and the team. Tanika is also currently playing club volleyball for the Auckland Central women's open grade team.

When asked about her experiences as an athlete, this is what Tanika had to say:

What is the best part about competing?

The best part is the adrenaline. And the thrill and excitement. Seeing everything come together, everything you've worked so hard for just work. I also love the hype and challenges for harder hits, higher jumps, and more intercepts.

What age were you when you started playing sport?

I started netball around year 3 and volleyball in Year 8, but only started competing in volleyball in Year 9. I've played a whole bunch of sports like basketball, cheerleading and stuff.

What motivates you as an athlete?

Goals. You need something to work for, otherwise, why are you doing it? It's about the drive and seeing improvement as well. You need to know that you're getting better. It's also always been satisfying to push myself to limits and past breaking point to see what I can achieve.

What commitment is involved and how much time does sport demand?

Playing sport at this level requires a lot of commitment. I was once told, "You need to sacrifice social time and a whole lot of other stuff", but I never realised that until these past two years. I am constantly having to sacrifice social time and school work and so many other things and it's hard because often I feel like I'm an outsider but then I remember why I do it and why I love it and it's all worth it. There are times where I'd train five times a week for volleyball and gym in the mornings before school. At the moment, I gym about four times a week and have training two or more times. I also have netball training games on the weekend. So it's up to 12 hours a week.

What do you do in your free time?

In my free time I like to run, surf, read, and sing/ play piano or guitar. Also, I go to church and youth and spend time with friends. To be honest I don't have much free time because when I'm not at sports, I'm working to pay for my petrol to get there.
