**WASTE MANAGEMENT AND MINIMISATION:** Please note that:

- All students are required to take their morning-tea and lunch wrappers, uneaten food, etc. home with them. They cannot dispose of it at school.
- All containers/wrappers from our lunch providers (Subway, U-Sushi and Pita Pit) **must** be taken home to be disposed of. The bins at school cannot accommodate this volume of rubbish.
- The recycling bins at Golflands Campus have little provision for landfill items and food scraps.

Together with the above deliberate measures to reduce waste, increase recycling and improve sustainability, we would also like to strongly encourage all our parents to pack lunches in reusable containers and to buy in bulk.

**SCRIPTURE UNDERSTANDING AND APPLICATION:** We want to celebrate how students apply the Word of God in their lives. Students will have two larger passages of scripture to understand and apply each term. These verses relate to our Kotahitanga value for the term, with a hope to integrate character and scripture. In your child's homework book, there is a copy of the scripture focus and discussion prompts for families to use at home. This does not require any learning tasks, but is provided to help continue the conversation of scripture at home and deepen students' understanding and application of the verse. During the term, students will be asked to demonstrate their understanding and application of the scripture and will be able to choose a way to do this. It may be through memorisation and explanation orally, through journaling, drama, song, art work or a recorded presentation.

### **WERO WHITEWATER PARK:**

The 'Community Swim' organisation, in conjunction with Wero Whitewater Rafting Park in Manukau have offered us free sessions for our YEAR 5-6 students to have a go at white-water rafting, river crossings and an optional downriver swim! For the activity to go ahead, we will need three parents per class to come with us on the bus. (Additional parents who are not selected are welcome to join us to watch). Please note that activities are completely run by the

instructors and all parents need to have a current police clearance. This permission slip, in addition to a hard copy of a separate permission slip from WERO, must be completed and returned to school in order for your child to attend. The water safety programme is fully funded however, a bus fare of \$12.00 will be invoiced through KAMAR.

Your child's Wero trip will be approximately two hours, this includes;

- A 45 minute safety briefing where all the students will be given safety gear, including life jackets, helmets and wetsuits, and will be taught how to fit it correctly. They will also perform safety checks with their buddies. The activity will include a moving water safety briefing, terminologies and safety guidelines. There will also be a question and answer time to build confidence and understanding of the activity.
- The children will then proceed to the water with their instructors and learn to safely cross the moving water in a 'river crossing'.
- They will then participate in a white water rafting activity on the water with an instructor in each raft.
- There is also an optional swim wearing life jackets moving downriver in the Grade 1-2 Tamariki River. The whole activity is supervised by qualified outdoor educationalists and instructors. This is followed by 15 minutes to change after the activity (including hot showers).

What to bring to Wero;

Swimwear and a towel. For example, swimming togs, or a rash vest and shorts. (Students receive a Buoyancy aid, safety helmet, paddles and booties at the venue). A good idea would be to bring two towels- one for after the river crossing and one for after the downriver swim to ensure your child can dry off and stay warm. Along with wearing their school uniform and school jersey, students may bring an additional warm jacket. It might also be a good day to wear black track pants as part of the school uniform (as opposed to shorts or skorts) in order to retain warmth. Students must refrain from wearing jewellery or other valuables, and ipads need to remain at school (teachers will take plenty of photos and videos). Note- please do not place a school lunch order on the day of your child's Wero trip because they will not be at school at 12.00, instead please send a packed lunch.

Note- times are approximate. Students starting at 11:00 AM will be ready to depart at approximately 1:00 PM. Students starting at 12:30 PM will be ready to depart at approximately 2:30 PM. This finish/departure time will be determined by how long it takes for students to get changed after the activity.







The New Zealand Curriculum:
