### BIKE SAFE TRAINING FOR YEAR 5 & 6 STUDENTS

Our Year 5 and 6 students recently took part in the Bike Safe programme, which focuses on building confidence, bike handling, and safety skills. Delivered over two sessions (totalling 3 hours), the training included both theory and hands-on practice, such as helmet fitting, safety checks, and basic cycle skills. This programme follows the NZTA Cyclist Skills Training Guidelines and supports students in becoming safer, more confident riders.































# YEAR 6 BIBLE STUDY WITH MRS JAMES

As a firm believer in equipping our Elim children to stand on a solid foundation when it comes to their faith, and examining Biblical truths, we introduced a fortnightly Bible study for our year 6 students. Our focus has been to examine the Bible from an angle of apologetics and hermeneutics, demonstrating to our students the importance of understanding historical and cultural contexts, as well as literary contexts. The outcome has been something that can only be described as Holy Spirit inspired! We examined in our Bible lessons and Bible study, why the Bible is reliable and can be fully trusted. We explored the various extra-Biblical sources that undergird and support the truth and authenticity of the Bible and Jesus. We examined the roles of prominent and reliable Roman historians and authors like Josephus, Pliny and Tacitus, who all testified to the veracity of Jesus' teachings, supernatural works and crucifixion under Pontius Pilate.

In the lead up to Easter, we spent considerable time unpacking the seven statements Jesus made on the cross, and the cultural and etymological significance of what He said in Aramaic. We focussed on the four gospels and their reliable eye-witness accounts of who Jesus was, the details around His death and resurrection. As a summation of what we discussed and learned together, the children were asked to choose one of Jesus' 7 statements and write down why their statement of choice resonated with them. To say we were inspired by their responses, would be an understatement!

This term we have focussed on the Holy Spirit and the role He plays when we become a believer. This led to discussions around salvation, the trinity, angels (ministering spirits,) Lucifer and free will being the highest expression of God's love for us! The depth and profound level of the questions that have been asked in our Bible lessons and study, have been wonderfully inspiring! Seeing children commit their lives to the Lord and praying for family members who are yet to come to faith, has been a privilege to be part of and witness!

We will conclude this term by examining Paul's letters to the various churches, the pivotal role of the early church in the book of Acts, and why the apostle Paul was instrumental in propagating and spreading large sections of the New Testament.

What a blessing it is to be part of a school where we have been given the honour to freely share the gospel of Christ, that has the power to change lives!

# CHESS EXAMS

On Monday 16th June, forty-nine very eager chess students gathered in the Library to write their chess exams. The New Zealand Chess Federation offers a series of four written tests for young players, designed to be taken sequentially as they progress through their skills. Each level is progressively more challenging. While lower levels can be completed in a few months, the higher levels demand dedication and deep understanding—some students may spend an entire year mastering the skills needed to pass. These exams not only assess knowledge but also encourage persistence and growth in critical thinking. This term we had eight students pass the Level 1 Pawn exam, and two students pass the Level 2 Knight exam. We are very proud of all of our aspiring Chess Champions!

#### FIGHTING THE GOOD FIGHT AND FINISHING THE RACE!

Since 2009, and with the support of thousands of students across Australia and New Zealand, we have seen more than 340,000 students in South African public schools receive the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Many of these students are individuals with their own history of pain, rejection and hurt. Nomblemu's mother is a member of the occult. When she discovered a Bible in Nomblemu's schoolbag she tore the Bible in pieces, burnt it, doused it in water and threw it in the trash. Nell was abandoned by her parents and only saved from an orphanage by being taken in by a lady in their small community. Though the lady acted in love, this lady's son abused Nell and made her feel worthless. Irene felt so helpless and alone that she nearly took her own life. Steven was

> abandoned by his father at a young age and left alone with his mother, they felt like foreigners in their own village and were treated as outcasts.

Now let's share the impact that **Run4Bibles** has had on public school communities in **South Africa**. As God's Word is taken into these schools and students are taught of the God who created them, who loves them and has a plan and purpose for them, their lives are transformed. These students are inspired to be a positive influence in their schools, with their friends and in their families. Many of these students have brought other family members to faith and still others have used the resources they learned from to begin outreach in their wider communities. Students in South African public schools are so desperate



to read the Bible that one of our Coordinators in the school told us a story of how a student had 'stolen' a Bible from her classroom! These students have heard and responded to the call and can say: "I have fought the good fight. I have finished the race. I have served the Lord faithfully". 2 Tim 4:7 ERV

#### HOW?

Run4Bibles is designed to easily attach to any event your school is already running. This could be your Cross Country, athletics or swimming carnival, read-a-thon or any other event you are engaged in. This initiative encourages students to respond to participate and "fight the good fight to finish the race".

#### WHY SOUTH AFRICA?

In 2009 God opened a door for Bible League to get Bibles back into public schools. We were able to minister directly to these students, to speak into their situations, to open up possibilities in their future they may have never seen before and invite them into the life that God destined them to live.

With the launch of the 'parent-friendly' versions of both our national curricula, you will know exactly what your child is learning, why it's important, and when they'll be learning it, so that you can actively support and complement your child's learning at home and have meaningful conversations with your child's teacher or kaiako.



There are practice activities for each year level that you can do with your child, and 'tips and tricks' to support learning at home. Phonics cards come with parent guidance with audio files to model the correct sounds.

# Parent tip Practice is important when learning sounds and letters. Practising the sounds your mokopuna has learned, for up to 10 minutes a day, will help them to remember what they have been learning at kura. The slides are best viewed full screen. Select the 3 dots at the bottom of the slides and then select "Enter full screen".



There is also a guide on how to prepare for the first day of school, and tips for parent-teacher interviews.

#### ^ Years O to 3

In Years O to 3 (phase 1) the goal is for children to thrive in environments rich in literacy and maths. For information about what they will be learning, go to: <u>New Zealand Curriculum year-by-year learning guide</u>

#### Things to discuss

With your child's teacher, you may wish to discuss: • your child's phonics check (Years 0 and 1) - if your child hasn't completed one yet, ask the teacher when

- they will how you can support your child with structured
- literacy if you are not sure what this is, talk to the teacher and ask them to explain it how you can support your child with maths.



The webspace also houses important information about how children will be assessed in the early years of schooling through the new Phonics Checks and Hihira Weteoro. It describes how parents and whānau can access additional support that their child or tamaiti might need.



As the national curriculum continues to be updated and implemented in all schools and kura over the next few years, more resources and supports will become available for parents, caregivers and whānau.
