

This term our Year 0 students have been learning about different butterflies and their life cycles. We enjoyed making our own butterflies from polymer clay for our classoom inquiry.





This term, Year 2 have been exploring the fascinating world of the **Rocky Shore** as part of our inquiry learning. We discovered that the rocky shore is divided into different high tide zones, and that each zone is home to unique creatures. We also looked closely at seals, learning about their appearance, body functions, and place in the food chain. With Mrs Voisey, we have begun creating models of rocky shore habitats to show our understanding of how living things survive in these environments.

A highlight of our inquiry was our recent trip to Kelly Tarlton's. The children loved seeing the sea creatures up close, watching the penguins, and making connections between what we saw and what we have been learning in class. It was a fantastic hands-on experience that brought our inquiry to life!
































The students will be developing **bird feeders** this term, similar to the ones pictured that Stella and Shaydyn took the initiative to construct at home.

Based on their designs in groups, students will further refine their ideas to create durable seed or nectar feeders that will be located in the gardens behind Room 1 and 2.








In maths, Year 3 have been learning about 3D shapes. In the photo below Caleb and Shaydyn are holding balls, which are spheres.





On Wednesday 20 August, our Year 4 students enjoyed an exciting trip to the **Auckland Zoo**. Despite the chilly weather, the day was filled with discovery and learning.

As part of our Inquiry into the grasslands biome, students explored the amazing adaptations that God has designed in plants and animals to help them survive and thrive in their habitat. We made meaningful connections to our classroom learning about the symbiotic relationships between plants and animals in the grassland ecosystem. The visit brought these concepts to life and deepened our understanding of how living things depend on each other.

Thank you to our incredible parent helpers who supported us - we simply couldn't have this experience



































Our focus has been on developing well-structured narratives with clear characters, settings, problems, resolutions, and meaningful lessons. Students have also been learning how to enhance their writing with direct speech and new figures of speech.























This term, our Year 6s have dived into the fascinating world of the **Marine biome**. We are discovering how ocean ecosystems work, why they are vital to all life on Earth, and the challenges they face today. Each student has chosen a marine animal to research, exploring its unique habitat, behaviours, and the threats it encounters, such as pollution and climate change.

To bring their learning to life, students are designing and building diorama boxes that showcase their chosen biome and research findings. These creative displays will not only highlight their scientific understanding but also their artistic skills, offering a vivid glimpse into the wonders of our oceans—and why protecting them matters.

















Last week, Year 6 was visited by **Project Jonah**. The amazing educator named Eithne from Project Jonah talked to us about whales being stranded on the beach and how we can help them. We learnt about the Popoto dolphin which is the smallest dolphin in the world. At the end, we all lined up to measure the length of a blue whale – the biggest whale in the world, which is about 45 metres long.


