


#### **FATHER'S DAY ASSEMBLY**



#### What you need to do to get vetted:

- Come to the school office with 2 forms of Identification for example: your passport and driver's license.
- Fill in the form at the office and pay for the processing fee for the vetting.

If you have any questions in regards to vetting, please don't hesitate to ask at the Office.

Could you please come to the office to fill in the forms for vetting as soon as possible, as it takes a few weeks in order for you to help during our school disco in week 1.
