This is one of the highest levels of competition for young chess players in the country.

We caught up with the boys following their return to hear about their experience, from tactical triumphs to team dinners.

Q: What was the highlight of the tournament for you—on or off the board?

- Jamie: Winning a match in under five minutes.
- Jaden: Playing really hard opponents.
- Alex: Winning six out of seven matches.
- Jake: Having dinner all together at Lone Star—the Dixie chicken breast was so good!

Q: Was there a particular game or move you were especially proud of?

- Jamie: "Sacrificing the Rook for a win."
- Jaden: "Using a series of calculations to win a pawn tactically."
- Alex: "Winning my last game."
- Jake: "Forking the King and Queen."

Q: What did you learn from your opponents or the experience overall?

- Jamie: "Not to fall apart when a teammate loses."
- Jaden: "To use my time wisely when calculating moves."
- Alex: "Don't rush your game!"
- Jake: "Not to trap my King in the corner."

Q: How did it feel to represent your school in a national tournament?

- Jaden: "Exciting and fun as not many chances like this come around."
- Jamie & Alex: Both felt "good and proud."
- Jake: Admitted he "was nervous!"

Q: What advice would you give to students hoping to compete in chess tournaments?

- Jamie: "Be calm and think about your moves. Don't blunder!"
- Jaden: "Study hard and keep progressing even when things are difficult."
- Alex: "Don't overthink your moves."
- Jake: "Watch the time and move quicker if you are down to five minutes."

A massive congratulations to Jamie, Jaden, Alex, and Jake for their fantastic efforts and for proudly representing Elim Christian College on the national stage! We look forward to seeing what they achieve on next in their chess journey.














ELIM CHRISTIAN COLLEGE SPORT PHASE 1 ATHLETICS FUN DAY


