MATAHAU GOT PAPER FROM A NEARBY WHALING STATION AND TAUGHT OTHER MAORI TO READ. MATAHAU WAS BAP2ISED AND BY 1848, 13 CHAPELS HAD BEEN BUILT IN THE AREA.
