Thank you again for the Lego donations and the enthusiasm shown for this new initiative.








Cook Islands Language Week:

Year 3

Our new topic is 'Community' and especially our "Backyard Biome".

A biome is a large region of Earth that has a certain climate and certain types of living things. Major biomes include tundra, forests, grasslands, and deserts. Ecosystems and food webs exist within each biome. We will focus specifically on our own 'backyard' and ecosystems, habitats and food webs for New Zealand native wildlife.

We will be visiting the Auckland Zoo to learn more about the wonderful adaptations that help animals to thrive in their habitat. We will encourage our students to become active serving members of their community.

Year 4

In the Safari team, our learners will be focusing on "The Living World". Specifically, we will be putting our Science hats on to explore the different biomes and climates around the world. We will dive deeper into the ecosystems within the habitats of the African Savanna and how the animals function and thrive in their community.

We are very excited to go on our trip to the Auckland Zoo to investigate how animals are adapted to their habitat and observe animal features and behaviors in action! We are very excited to share our learning journey with you this term.

Year 5 & 6

The Forest Team has begun to embark on what it means to serve within a community. Our big ideas this term relate to Food Technology, Space, Animation and Film.

In week 9, the Year 5 & 6 students will visit the Auckland Stardome Observatory and Planetarium and participate in a space enrichment programme.

Leading up to this trip, students will compile their learning into Stop Motion projects that they will present to others. During the Stardome expedition, students will compare their in-class learning with the knowledge of the space experts!
