

YEAR 4

Year 4s are back in full swing with their learning and assessments this week. We started our PE sessions with learning large ball skills and playing dodgeball. This was complemented well with an afternoon of having Riley, the rugby coach from Pakuranga Rugby Club come in to teach us some rugby skills, such as passing and catching with our hands forming a W. We enjoyed short games of ripper rugby too. Though it was a new experience for some students and they were initially worried they would't do well, they still put in a positive attitude and gave it 100%.













YEAR 3

The Year 3 team has started to investigate Fabulous Food. We aren't looking at food like a chef, baker or consumer. We are looking at food like a scientist, seeing the different changes that happen with heat, motion or chemical reaction.

The students already did one experiment last week where Mrs Voisey brought in 5 pieces of cheese. Currently, each piece is in a plastic bag in our classroom changing everyday.

This week, we have been discussing where food comes from and sorting food into 3 groups. Students have identified which foods in their lunch box are from plants, animals or processed foods.


We can't wait to investigate more food and the changes that happen.

Our students shared a lot of knowledge about water with their teachers and we began learning how to ask 'thick' questions beginning with "why" or "how" relating to our topic. We came up with some burning questions that they wish to answer. We look forward to doing lots of experiments this term to learn about the changes in states of matter that we see in our everyday lives.

We embrace their creativity and curiosity as they make a splash in their learning journey!
