


CELEBRATING SPORTS ACHIEVEMENTS OUTSIDE OF SCHOOL

FOOTBALL

Cael Samuel (Y10) is one of our very talented football players! He has been developing his skills over a number of years and putting long hours into his training, fitness and development. He is doing exceptionally well and is taking up all the opportunities presented to him this season.

He plays for Bucklands Beach Football Club in 2 of their top football teams, which include under 15's and under 17's.

The Under 15's Bucklands Beach team have been excelling this season. At a number of the U15's games, there has been the All Whites Under 17 scout present.

Cael has been selected 3 times now to attend the Regional Talent Centre. This is a 3 day camp run by the U17's NZ Coach Martin Bullock at the QBE Stadium on the North Shore. There are a number of high profile coaches who take the players through development training and fitness tests. They also play games against previous years teams. Talent Scouts attend games of U15 grades from all over Auckland and only 20 students are selected each time to attend the camp. They are run throughout the year, and each time players work hard to retain their spot to be selected for the next camp. Cael has just received news he has been accepted into the next camp. Congratulations!

Cael's goal is to be invited to the National training camp, where players are selected through these Regional Camps. From this camp players are selected to represent New Zealand in the U17 World Cup in 2023.

Cael has also had the exciting opportunity in his Under 15 team to play against the NZ All White Ferns women's team as part of their preparation in the lead up to the Olympics.

Earlier last term Cael trialled for the U16 Futsal team and was selected to represent Northern Region Football Auckland in the NZ Youth Futsal Championships Tournament held in Wellington between 17-19th July. The team played well and ended up 5th out of 12 teams.

Cael is very motivated and determined; and puts in a lot of hard work. He trains twice a week with the U15's team and once a week with the U17's team. He plays games on the Weekend and on his "off" days he works on his fitness by running 70 minutes on the treadmill and works on doing more technical skills and speed training.

Well done Cael on all the opportunities you have worked extremely hard for. We are excited to watch the space ahead as you continue to pursue your football aspirations.
