FIRST FEW DAYS OF SCHOOL

Friday, 2nd February 2024

This is for **all year 7** students and **only new Y8, new Y9, and new Y10 students** School begins at 8.40 am

There will be class lists displayed on the hall windows. Teachers and Middle Years prefects will be on hand to direct new students. They go to their tutor spaces at 8.40 am.

Monday, 5th February 2024

All students start back on site. School begins at 8.40 am

Class lists will be displayed on the windows in the year-level areas. Whānau lead teachers will be out and about in their trademark high viz Pink vests to direct students. They go to their tutor spaces at 8.40 am.

UNIFORM

All items of school uniform may be worn in summer or winter as appropriate to the weather conditions. **Please ensure that all items are clearly named.** Refer to the school website for requirements and further information than what's provided here: https://www.elim.school.nz/uniform/

Please note:

- Year 7-10 students must wear a regulation uniform sun hat in Terms 1 and 4, when outside. No hat -No play. Students will be required to stay under the shade of the veranda on days that they do not have a hat.
- Sandals may only be worn in Term 1 and Term 4. Shoes and socks may be worn all year round.
- For girls whose hair reaches the collar, it must be tied up and off the face at all times. Hair for boys must not reach the collar and must be off the face at all times. If it is tied up, a single black hair tie is permitted.
- No outlandish hairstyles are permitted and no nail or hair extensions are permitted. No exceptions.
- Girls' skirts must be knee length- when seated the skirt is on the knee.
- Single small loops or plain studs can be worn in ear lobes only. Apart from a watch, no other jewelry is permitted.
- Appropriate Taonga may be worn, we acknowledge and celebrate the cultural significance of Taonga worn by students.
- No religious symbols need to be worn.

Please note that parents and students have a two-week grace period to purchase the required stationery items. This is to accommodate subject options . **All stationery including digital devices MUST be named.**

MOBILE DEVICES

- Mobile phones are not learning devices.
- Mobile phones must not be used during the school day.
- If parents need to be contacted students will need permission from a teacher to use the phone.
- Parents are requested to support the school with this expectation.
- All mobile phones must be switched off and either left in the school bag or handed in to the teacher for safekeepingfor the day.
- More details about healthy mobile phone management at school will be explained to students on the first day.
- It is expected that students charge their devices at home each night ready for learning the next day.

LUNCH ORDERS

There are several options for students to buy food for lunch during the week via the KINDO App, however, we also encourage students to bring a healthy packed lunch from home most days. Please ensure that only water is in drink bottles- we strongly discourage sugary and excessively sweet fruit drinks at school.

WE ARE COMMITTED TO CONTINUALLY IMPROVING THE SAFETY OF OUR CHILDREN. THROUGH OUR COLLECTIVE ACTIONS AROUND THIS MATTER, WE ENABLE POSITIVE LEARNING DEVELOPMENT FOR STUDENTS' AWARENESS OF THEIR SAFETY AND OTHERS IN THEIR COMMUNITY.

SOME TIPS TO ASSIST WITH IMPROVING ROAD USER SAFETY:

WE APPRECIATE CHILDREN BEING ON TIME TO SCHOOL BUT IF YOU ARE RUNNING LATE WITH YOUR CHILDREN, SAFETY IS STILL IMPORTANT. YOU CAN SIMPLY TAKE THEM TO THE OFFICE TO SIGN IN.

PLEASE DO NOT COMPLETE U-TURNS, RATHER USE THE SIDE STREETS OR LOOP AROUND BOB CHARLES DRIVE TO GO THE OTHER WAY.

MIDDLE YEARS STUDENTS WITH SIBLINGS IN THE JUNIOR SCHOOL ARE ENCOURAGED TO USE THE SIDE ENTRANCES: SIMON OWEN AND MONTECITO PLACE. PLEASE ADHERE TO ROAD RULES IN THESE RESIDENTIAL ROADS.

IT IS AGAINST THE TRAFFIC LAWS TO PARK WITHIN 1 METRE OF A DRIVEWAY.

YOU ARE NOT PERMITTED TO PARK ON YELLOW NO-PARKING LINES.

NO DOUBLE PARKING IS PERMITTED.

NO VEHICLES ARE TO ENTER THE SCHOOL BUS BAY DURING PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF TIMES.

WE UNDERSTAND THAT IT IS MORE DIFFICULT WHEN THE WEATHER IS WET, HOWEVER PLEASE REMEMBER THAT ALL OTHER FAMILIES ARE ALSO BATTLING THE POOR WEATHER. <u>CHILD SAFETY REMAINS THE HIGHEST PRIORITY AND SO ROAD</u> <u>RULES STILL MUST BE ADHERED TO.</u> ENSURE YOUR CHILD EXITS YOUR VEHICLE ONTO THE PAVEMENT SIDE, NOT THE ROADSIDE.

ALL ADULTS AND CHILDREN SHOULD BE USING THE DESIGNATED PEDESTRIAN CROSSING TO CROSS THE ROAD SAFELY AT ALL TIMES.
