Please note, they have changed the gender of two of the characters in this version of "King Lear". Kent, the King's loyal advisor, is now a female character. This should be an interesting change as it appears that Kent's role may involve more of an unrequited love story than the original of servant and master. However, Edmund, who is one of the villains, is also now a female character. Edmund traditionally attempts to seduce two of the king's daughters in order to become King. In Shakespeare's original version of the play we see this through love letters, conversations and murderous plots. We will debrief these changes as part of our Year 13 English programme.
