


YEAR 9 AND 10 STEAM



For their final project in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Maths), Year 9/10 students were put in groups of 3-4 and were challenged to build a balloon-powered racer that could travel 5m as fast as possible. Their design had to include at least half a plastic soft-drink bottle. Project-based learning like this helps develop 21st century skills such as creativity, collaboration, communication and critical thinking. The winning group made a catapult that used the elastic potential of the balloon to fire their 'racer' the 5m distance in just 1.5 seconds!




TAIMA KORERO
