My wife, Charmayne, and I both had grandfathers who served as soldiers in WW1 and were gassed in the trenches. Both our grandfathers survived but with damaged lungs.



These photos show the remains of Charmayne's grandfather's gas mask. When the troops saw the gas, (chlorine, phosgene, or the so-called 'mustard gas') approaching, they would put on their mask. Inside the mask was a snorkel attached to a tube which, in turn, was attached to a canister which filtered out the poisonous gas. The helmet was claustrophobic and hot. There are accounts of wounded men ripping off their mask only to die a painful and choking death.



I invite you to read the poem Dulce et Decorum Est by Wilfred Owen which confronts the lie of the glory of war and the horror of the soldiers' experience.

Dulce et Decorum Est is a Latin phrase which means "It is sweet and fitting to die for one's country".



I also share photos of my grandfather's Bible, carried in his tunic pocket in the hellish trenches of France. This Bible was passed on to me and has since been passed on to my eldest grandchild.

In it are written the words; "Peace I leave with you; "My peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid". John 14:7

I am thankful for a school which exposes the lie of violence, hatred, and revenge and teaches the truth that in Jesus there is a far better way of love, forgiveness, and reconciliation.
