Yet the truth is HE has, and we will never know just how blessed we have been by HIM until someday in the future. As a school we have, alongside you, daily committed everything to God's faithful care.

Thank you to our school community for walking the journey with us, thank you for trusting us with your tamariki's care, their learning, and the shaping of character. We appreciate each and all our families and what is done in the home. It is a partnership worth developing further in 2023. We look forward to doing this.

Most certainly over the past few weeks it has been such a delight to hold face to face prize giving events, celebrating student progress and achievement. If your child is returning next year and you would like to review their progress and achievement with us at the earliest possible opportunity, we would welcome and provide for that in the new year.

As we said at the start of 2022, this year for us as school, was always going to be a financially challenging one and this has proven to be the case. Climbing out of difficult times financially is hard for us and for you as families also. With huge gratitude and humility, we thank all those whanau who have been able to contribute the special character donation, the camp fees, the subscriptions for such things as mathex, the contributions for Seesaw, schoology and education perfect ...wow we so appreciate this.

If any families can still make the special character donation (tax deductible) it will dramatically help and of course there is the legislative requirement to pay the proprietor the attendance dues.

There are however quite a number of sport fees remaining unpaid and if the sports dept is to continue its equitable provision and winning way, fees from everyone are needed. If your child wishes to play in 2023, the fees for 2022 must be paid this week.

Please would you take time this week to return all school property if you haven't already. We particularly need textbooks and readers back for storage, cataloguing and repair. Sports and/or music equipment must come in and sports uniforms should come back urgently, washed and in good repair.
