We look forward to seeing all students on campus this coming Monday 24 April for the start of term. Yes Tuesday is ANZAC Day and therefore is a public holiday but we still wanted to use Monday to kick start school again and invest in the lives of your tamariki.

Staff Only Days 2023

We have already had one staff only day and there are more to come. The government has given all schools at least two professional development days towards what is called the 'Curriculum Refresh'. However bearing in mind that we have now had two strike days (impact on Y11-13 at BC) and with more withdrawal of labour to come, we have reassessed what we will do based on:

- 1. We hosted a staff only day on Monday 6 March thank you
- 2. We estimate a number of days have effectively been lost for NCEA students
- 3. We recognise that staff only days propose a challenge for parents
- 4. We will not now hold a staff only day on Monday 24 April or May 5
- 5. We still wish to give staff access to 3 more professional days spread out through the remainder of the year

- 10 Aug for our Special Character development
- 9 November (once Y11-13 have gone on exam leave)
