Kia Ora Elim community

In this update i again share a few snippets and messages but especially I wish to cover **what school** will most likely look like in Alert Level 3.

Firstly, a powerful scripture for us all:

In **Psalm 37:25** David speaks of God's provision and claims that in his entire life the Lord has provided for him. "*I was young and now I am old, yet I have never seen the righteous forsaken.....*". So Elim Whanau, keep placing your trust in HIM because HE cares for you.

There are several things we would like to say about **Alert Level 3 and school.** If the PM signals a move for Auckland to Level 3, we anticipate schools will be required to open either from Wednesday 22 or Thursday 23rd September.

1. We have a strong plan and outline of how we will operate at Level 3, and this will be communicated once we have confirmation from the Prime Minister.

2. Operating any form of face-to-face schooling at Level 3 under the Delta variant has a number of health and safety challenges. As a state integrated school, we are relying on what the MOH and MOE tell us. We are using their guidance to do the best we can to minimise risk and maximise health and safety. It is our firm belief that most if not all students should continue to learn from home, as hard as that is at times.

3. Y11-13 all continue to learn from home for all of Level 3. Y11-13 students must not come on site.

4. If required, we will <u>only open one campus</u> at Level 3 for Y1-10 students and that will be Golflands.

5. Parents and visitors are not permitted to come on site at Level 2 and 3. Staff will meet families at the gates. <u>All adults arriving at school for drop offs and pickups must have a mask on and maintain social distancing.</u> This is mandatory.

6. There is <u>no requirement from MOH or MOE for anyone on a school site to be vaccinated.</u> In addition, the MOE in particular have said many, many times that we cannot ask or demand in any way that a person - adult or child, declare their vaccination status. Therefore, we operate school at Alert Level 3 on that basis.

7. Our 'opening the school at Level 3' plan is based on a Gold, Silver & Bronze approach: This reflects our transparency, our desire for maximum risk reduction, our aim to preserve wellbeing of staff still teaching online; student health and well-being and our recognition of the supreme difficulties of operating school on and off site!

Gold Standard: (our responsibility for maximum health and safety)

- a maximum of 2 student learning bubbles (maximum of 10 students)
- staff assigned to a bubble on site do not also have online teaching commitments
- all staff on site have been vaccinated

Silver Standard: (still our responsibility for maximum health and safety but with less guarantees under the level)

- a maximum of 3 student learning bubbles (maximum of 10 students)
- <u>the vast majority of staff on site</u> assigned to a bubble do not have online teaching commitments
- most staff on site have been vaccinated

Bronze Standard: (still our responsibility for maximum health and safety but with rapidly increasing reduction in being able to manage the COVID risk as we see it under the level)

- more than 3 student learning bubbles (maximum of 10 students)
- staff on site assigned to a bubble will most likely also have online teaching commitments
- an equal number of staff on site have and have not been vaccinated
