

Principal's Update 2 September 2022

Kia Ora one and all

Life seems to be dominated by the challenge of us as a community navigating all the sicknesses surrounding us. Thank you for your grace and understanding regarding the functioning of school, of year groups of onsite and online learning.

There has hardly been a day this year when we have had all staff onsite and healthy. You will also see this mirrored at times in your own family. Every school is reporting the same difficulties.

Currently this week we have Y5 at GCJY working from home, some year groups at GCMY will be learning online for single days soon; and for one week our senior school at BC were online such was the incidence of COVID in students and staff.

In between these times, we continue to encourage full attendance (although this has not been achieved this year), hold trips and the full breadth and depth of learning programmes.

COVID Management


We have compost and tree guards ready to be used. The planting will be followed by a sausage sizzle with vegetarian and gluten free options, as well as a few other snacks.
