## PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE 22 MAY

One week back onsite for 80% of our students, another week of distance learning for others and those winter bugs have started to emerge. Thanks everyone for your commitment to this week. Life continues to be different and we are all having to adapt.

We said last week we would go one week at a time and I can report that each campus has had a wonderful start back this week. This is so good. The atmosphere was great, purposeful, ordered and yet relaxed both in class and at break times

It is our intention to continue in the coming week, the same 'start back regulations' we have used this week. Thank you parents for your superb support as this community has navigated the new normal. Even though there is increasingly a low risk of the virus getting in the school gates, we will be keeping up our hygiene practices and other public health measures as an extra precaution.

We had the Howick and Pakuranga Times photographer on site at GC happily snapping 'approved' photos of students with their sanitiser bottles and our GC librarian Claire Galbraith sanitising returned books. It is significant that 1700 library books were loaned out to families for their use during the lockdown! This is something I am so proud of. Well done library team we love your work.

As indicated, this past week just under 20% of our students were absent. A quick glance at the reasons for the absences would indicate that over 80% were because of the COVID situation / distance learning with increasing seasonal sickness.
