## I write regarding (1) Strike Notification (2) Measles (3) International Homestays at MAC (4) weather events and (5) lost property

Strike Action: Here are our decisions regarding the all day strike this Thursday 11 May:

As with all other strike days, we as a school will remain open on two campuses Golflands and Mt Albert. We regret having to close Botany Campus but we just do not have the staff or the relievers to keep teaching and learning going.

We ask non-union teachers at BC to travel to GC/MAC to teach on that day and we appreciate their willingness to do this.

We also recognise the right and the commitment of our union members to proceed with the planned action.

**Measles - A message from Public Health:**\_Measles is highly infectious and babies, young children and non-immune pregnant women are vulnerable to serious illness.

Many older secondary students and young teachers may have missed out on MMR vaccination.\_Please prepare for measles as there will be more imported cases.

• Staff members born after 1969 are to check they have **proof** of two MMR vaccinations or having had measles. Staff will need proof to avoid quarantine if they are exposed to the virus. Additional MMR vaccinations are free of charge.

• Please remind parents and caregivers that children and young people should have two MMR vaccinations to avoid disruption to their education.

• Vaccination records are in the Wellchild/Plunket book or ask your doctor.

• If we have a case of measles at our school, Public Health will work with you to decide who will need to stay home because they are not immune.

**International Homestays at MAC**: parents of our Mt Albert Campus - it's incredible for us as a school to have so many international students wanting a place. Have you ever had the wonderful opportunity to host a short-term international student? Currently we have excellent students wishing to join MAC for 4 weeks through to one full term. It is an amazing cultural interaction experience for you as a family and for the international student. The homestay fee ensures any costs you have are well met.
