

REPORTING STUDENT PROGRESS AND ACHIEVEMENT POLICY Objective 3

Rationale

Student progress and achievement can be significantly enhanced through the partnership of home and school. Assessment information must therefore be reported in plain language to both students and parents/caregivers.

Purpose

The purpose of the reporting student progress and achievement policy is to ensure that Elim Christian College fulfils its obligations to report to parents in plain language in writing at least twice a year.

Guidelines

- 1. The school is required to:
 - Report to students and their parents on the achievement of individual students
 - Report to school's community on the achievement of students as a whole and of groups including:
 - who are not achieving;
 - who are at risk of not achieving;
 - who have learning support needs
 - o aspects of the curriculum which require particular attention
 - the achievement of Māori and Pacific People students against plans and targets
- **2.** Where a school has students enrolled in years 1-8, the board of trustees, with the principal and teaching staff:
 - Report to students and their parents on the student's progress and achievement. Reporting to parents in plain language in writing must be at least twice a year;
 - Report school-level data in the board's annual report:
 - o school strengths and identified areas for improvement;
 - o the basis for identifying areas for improvement; and
 - o planned actions for lifting achievement.

• Report in the board's annual report on:

- the numbers and proportions of students at, above, below or well below the expectations, including by Māori, Pacific People Students, by gender and
- o how students are progressing, as well as how they are achieving.
