EXPRESSION OF INTEREST TO BE A ROAD PATROL MONITOR IN 2026

Elim Christian College Golflands Campus has a Kea Crossing to facilitate the safe crossing of our students from one side of Golfland Drive to the other. Kea Crossings are installed around schools so school patrols can control traffic and safely guide children across the street. A Kea Crossing only operates when a school patrol is present. When the school patrol displays their STOP signs, traffic must stop. This helps keep children safe when they're going to and from school. When there's no school patrol and no crossing signs, the crossing point is just like any other section of road.

We are looking for more members to join our team of responsible children who are in Year 6 or Year 7 this year, to be trained as Kea Crossing Patrols. Although many students will want to be a part of this team, it will also require a commitment on the part of parents. Students who are part of the road patrol team will need to be on patrol 8.15-8.40am or at 2.55 -3.15pm. Each team will be rostered on each week with a reserve team in case of absence. **There will be a training session on the morning of Tuesday 10th February with our local Police Officer at ECC Golflands Campus.** This is compulsory training for any student wishing to be part of the road patrol team. Our local Police Officer will have to be confident with the student's ability to do this role before they are confirmed as patrollers.
