

Year 7/8 Term 3, 2023 Newsletter

Dear parents, caregivers and whānau,

We have had a very settled start to Term 3. I would like to commend the students for completing their animal posters following our zoo trip last term. They were creative and displayed a high standard of work. Please see the two examples below.

In Term 3 our biblical theme is looking at "God is calling us to walk with Him". We will be looking at stories in the bible that reveal ways people have walked with God, particularly in the Old Testament, as we covered the New Testament last year. As a Christian school we do expect the students to learn the bible verses that are part of the weekly homework programme.

Our main Term 3 inquiry topic comes from our social studies unit, which looks at the NZ Government and Politics. This coincides with this year's general election. The unit looks at local and national government, how laws are made and the general election.

This term our science unit is on "Forces & Motion", where students will investigate simple machines.

In mathematics our main focus is on the geometry & measurement strands of the curriculum. While students will continue the normal maths work in their books, they will also work in small groups on a Geometocity activity where they build their own model of a city. We ask that students continue learning their times tables at home.

This year we will be entering a Year 7 team and a separate Year 8 team into the Mathex Competition, which is held at the Barfoot & Thompson Stadium, Selwyn College on 24 August at 6.30pm.

Our literacy focus is persuasive speeches, with our speech finals being held on Wednesday 23th August at 11.45am in the Ballroom. Please note that an email was sent out last week with information around topics.

We will be having a schoolwide celebration, Book Week in Week 9. This will be followed by the Year 7 & 8 Sports Camp in Week 10.

HOMEWORK: Students will receive a homework sheet every week. Homework will include work that reinforces what is happening in the classroom and will include spelling activities, a memory verse, a reading chart and some aspect of NZ history. Maths homework will be done through the Education Perfect software. Students may also be asked to finish work that was not completed in classroom sessions.

WASTE MANAGEMENT AND MINIMISATION: All students are required to take their morning-tea and lunch wrappers, uneaten food, etc. home with them. They cannot dispose of it at school.
